The best place to put your feet during the show is:

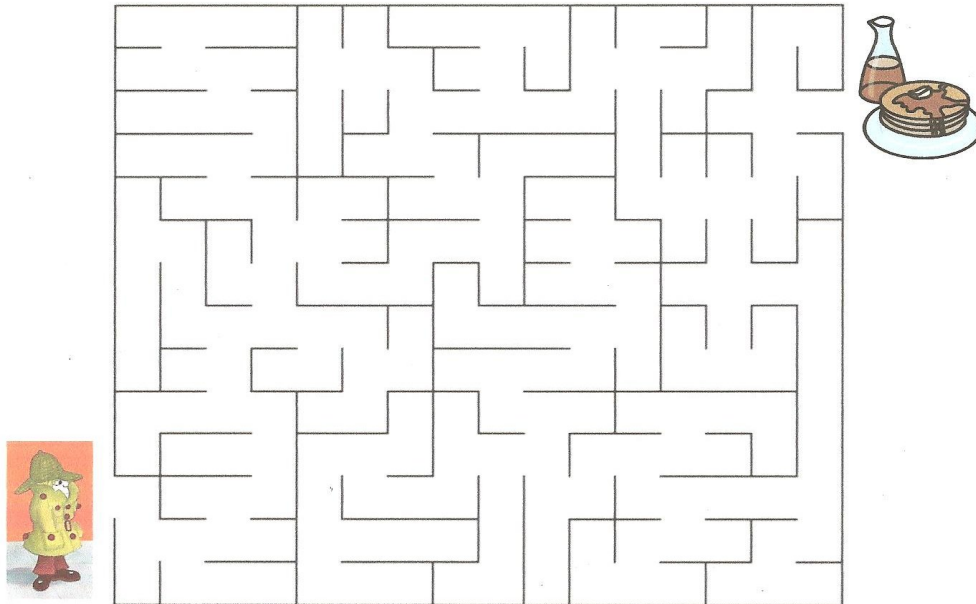
- A. On the floor or hanging straight down from your seat.
